**[Common 6] Concerning marking of JIS Mark on the industrial and mineral products at its delivery site where the product was assembled.**

Question:

With regard to an industrial and mineral product which comprises multiple parts assembled, is it permitted to ship the parts separately from different factories or warehouses which are included within the coverage of the JIS certification accredited, assemble them into the product, and then indicate the JIS Mark, etc. on it?

Interpretation:

- 1) The indication of the JIS Mark, etc. is basically the quality assurance at the time of shipping the product from a factory. Accordingly, it is not permitted to indicate the JIS Mark, etc. on a finished product assembled at a site to which its parts had been separately delivered.
- 2) All components of a product must be shipped as gathered together (including the state of being packed up together) and must be in a state that the JIS Mark, etc. is indicated on them. However, it is possible that a main component on which the JIS Mark indication is made and another specific component which was shipped from another factory are assembled into a finished product at their delivery site.
